Key elements

To help us plan the delivery of infrastructure that meets the needs of our growing city, we are focusing on:

Cost and sustainability

We need to plan big projects in a cost-effective way by encouraging the sequencing of growth where our infrastructure is located or planned.



Protecting land for infrastructure

We need to ensure land for the future delivery of infrastructure is identified and protected as our city grows, with appropriate buffers around these sites and corridors to ensure safety and flexibility for future change.



Transport

The way we move people and goods around our city is changing. We need to make sure people can get where they need to be, with options to use public and active transport and emerging technologies.



Social infrastructure

Facilities for education, health, recreation and social purposes are important as our diverse city grows. We need to plan where we locate these vital community assets, and how we design, access and use them.



Utilities

It's important that we get the basics right (like water, sewerage, stormwater, energy, telecommunications), and consider opportunities for efficiency and sustainability in these networks.
